Dear Mr. Alonzi:

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reviewed conformity determination documents for the *Amended Horizon 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan*, and the *Horizon 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program*, submitted by the El Paso Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for interagency consultation and review. A new conformity determination is necessary for the El Paso, Texas particulate matter with a diameter of up to 10 microns (PM₁₀) nonattainment area and carbon monoxide (CO) maintenance area due to the adoption of the amended Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), and the need to comply with the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act signed into law on December 4, 2015.

Any issues associated with the demonstration of conformity were addressed in conference calls and emails with the El Paso MPO, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, the Texas Department of Transportation, and the EPA. The criteria for our review and the interagency consultation process can be found at 40 CFR Part 93, Subpart A and guidance memoranda issued by the FHWA and the EPA for transportation conformity determinations.

Based on the information submitted to the EPA and discussed during the interagency consultation process, the estimated emissions of CO and PM₁₀ for the amended Horizon 2040 MTP and Horizon 2017-2020 TIP will be below the motor vehicle emissions budgets (MVEBs) established for these pollutants in the respective State Implementation Plans (SIPs) for each: The CO SIP was approved by the EPA on August 4, 2008 (73 FR 45163); and the PM₁₀ SIP was approved by the EPA on January 18, 1994 (59 FR 02535). We have no further comments and are supportive of a positive conformity finding by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for the El Paso area.
